Key Knowledge

By the end of this unit pupils will..

begin to form lowercase letters correctly using the Read Write Inc phrases and pictures and use “and” to join two simple sentences containing key vocabulary from the story.

Simple Sentences:

A simple sentence is a group of words that conveys an idea. Each simple sentence needs to start with a capital letter and end with a full stop (.) Children will have actions to help them remember each of the punctuation.

Children will generate and orally say simple sentences to describe the last wolf, and then use “and” to join two sentences together. (The wolf lives in the woods and he has round glasses.) They will use their phonics to help them spell words with sounds they know in.




By the end of this unit pupils will..






“The Last Wolf” is a fiction story that is a twist on the traditional tale of “Little Red Riding Hood.” It follows a girl called Little Red who tried to catch a wolf, but can’t find one in the woods. Eventually she finds the last wolf living in a tree-cave with the last bear and the last lynx. They tell Little Red about how the woods have changed, and how new hoesus have been built in the woods. Little Red thinks of a way to help the animals get their home back.

Could you go on a hunt in your local woods and see what animals you can find?
