## **Background**

Dobcroft Schools are suffering from a "perfect storm" in terms of funding:

- All schools across England are facing budget cuts in real terms.
- Due to an outdated funding formula, Sheffield receives a below average level of education funding.
- As a suburban school with low levels of disadvantage, Dobcroft receives less funding per child than most other schools in Sheffield.

Over the last 4-5 years, the schools have managed this pressure via cost reductions. They have involved increasingly difficult choices. 2017-18 saw both governing bodies choosing between which option would affect children's education least.

Dobcroft Infant School requires a new roof, at a cost of £90,000. However, the annual Capital Expenditure budget for the school is just £7,320.

Dobcroft Junior School requires mobile classroom repairs at a cost of £60,000, but the annual Capital Expenditure budget of £8,000 is already allocated.

Governors have prepared 2018-19 budgets, and the **pressures** are greater than ever. If the schools are to provide the quality of education we all strive for, **increasing income rather than cost reduction** is the only way of achieving this.

The National Fair Funding Formula proposed by the Government is a red herring for our schools. Income growth is expected to lag behind cost increases for the foreseeable future in education.


# Average Spend per School by Region (Per Pupil 2014-2015)





### **How Your Money Is Spent**

The Friends of Dobcroft Schools (FODS) is a Charity (Number 1142672), the charter sets out that money can only be spent to directly enhance the education and welfare of children at Dobcroft Infant and Junior Schools. Expenditure is split equally between Infant and Junior Schools. The heads of both schools and the chair of FODS are trustees of the charity.

Typical expenditure includes:

- New playground equipment
- IT equipment & Refurbishing classrooms
- Special Events and Visits

#### **How Much Could You Give?**

All regular donations to FODS are completely voluntary and confidential.

Our target is to consistently raise an additional £1 per pupil per day (£20 per child per month), but any regular donation will have a huge impact.

£5 per pupil per month could:

- Repair playground equipment
- Enable essential buildings and grounds maintenance

£10 per pupil per month could, in addition:

- Provide new IT equipment and training for children
- Address the budget deficits of both schools
- Restore Teaching Assistants in classrooms to previous levels, having a direct impact on pupil performance.

£20 per pupil per month could, in addition:

- Return real term funding to "pre-austerity" levels
- Provide improved building facilities
- Increase the one-on-one teacher time for all children





## **Dobcroft Schools Funding Crisis**

Dobcroft Infant and Junior schools are facing an unprecedented shortfall in funding. Despite employing all staff on the lowest reasonable rates, maintaining the maximum permissible staff to student ratios, and slashing all expenditure on maintenance and equipment, the infant school briefly went into the red in 2017. This is the first time in history that the school has gone into the red.

School funding from central government is now below the level required to fulfil the basic educational and welfare needs of our children.

This leaflet sets out the ways in which you can support Dobcroft Schools, to ensure that your children receive the education and school experience we all desire.
