#### Attendance & Punctuality

Attendance target 2024–25: 97.5%. Currently school is at 97.1% (96.6% last week). Remember reduced % means 'Learning time lost'!

A reminder that the chief medical officer encourages children to attend school if they have a cold, however if they have sickness, or diarrhoea, they need to remain absent for **48 hours** after the last time this occurs. If your child has a temperature, they need to remain off school. Attendance as often as possible is important for your child.

**Punctuality:** It is important that you aim to be in school for the start time. This is **8.55am** in Foundation Stage and **9am** in Y1 and Y2. This is the time your child needs to be on the carpet, things put away ready for register and to learn, not when you are arriving at the entrance. Arriving late is disruptive to both your own child and the rest of the class. It is also likely your child will have missed some key learning for the day. This week **0.73%** of children were marked as late.

# Ask me about...

Each week your class teacher will update this area with information about what your chid has been learning during the week so that you can ask them questions about it.

# Ladybirds

This week the Ladybirds have been enjoying their new under the sea topic. We have been looking at different under the sea creatures as well as drawing our own. We have been using our dough to create under the sea creatures as well as seaweed and shells. We have been making patterns with our rocks and shells as well as using pegs to make patterns.

We have been working hard this week to regulate our emotions and have been practicing mindfulness techniques together. Our rainbow breathing, balloon breathing and bubble focus has helped us when our bodies and brains are feeling too busy. We have talked about what behaviours we like to see in Ladybirds and what behaviours are not ok.

#### Things from home

Please <u>do not</u> allow your child to bring in things from home <u>especially food!</u> These things are hard to monitor and we have had many incidents of things getting, lost and broken or disagreements breaking out over things from home. These things rarely stay in their bags, even when instructed, and we are not able to keep track of everyone's belongings. We have many children with allergies so it is very unsafe for children to bring food in that we are unaware of. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

#### Foundation Stage Two (Otters, Mice and Badgers)

We have had another great week in Reception and have been focusing on sharing odd and even numbers in maths along with sorting number bond equations to 10. Drawing club this week has been on the traditional tale, Goldilocks and the Three Bears and children have been bringing their drawings to life with their sentence and number codes.

In PE children have begun preparing for sport days by practising team games, races and their cheering! Children have continued showing their baby photos and are enjoying matching the number of the baby on the board to the picture of them now in a 'look at how we've grown' booklet.

#### Y1 (Hedgehogs, Squirrels and Foxes)

English – We have planned and written a story about a journey through the savannah.

Maths – We have learned about measuring capacity

Computing – We learned about online safety

PE - Gymnastics and invasion games.

RHE – We have learned about how we are different and about sun safety.

Science – We recapped our knowledge of our Science by completing a quiz.

RE – We have learned about babies are welcomed into a faith community.

#### Year 2 (Woodpeckers, Kingfishers and Eagles)

English – We have written sentences with a range of suffixes and conjunctions in.

Maths – We have recapped the methods for solving addition, subtraction, multiplication and division equations.

PSHE – We looked at gender stereotypes and how boys and girls can both do the same jobs and hobbies..

RE – We talked about significant places in our lives and how churches are a place of worship for Christians

Computing – We used Scratch Junior to move a "sprite" character using different commands.

We have also continued practising for our end of year play – keep learning your lines at home!
