Medium Term plans give a detailed overview, progression maps show the progression of skills that chilldren will learn over the course of their time at school (FS2 to Y2), and knowledge organisers show the crucial knowledge that children are expected to know and remember for each block of learning (usually per term or half term).

Attendance & Punctuality

Attendance target 2024-25: **97.5%.** Currently school is at **97.0%** (**97.1**% last week). Remember reduced % means 'Learning time lost'!

A reminder that the chief medical officer encourages children to attend school if they have a cold, however if they have sickness, or diarrhoea, they need to remain absent for **48 hours** after the last time this occurs. If your child has a temperature, they need to remain off school. Attendance as often as possible is important for your child.

Punctuality: It is important that you aim to be in school for the start time. This is **8.55am** in Foundation Stage and **9am** in Y1 and Y2. This is the time your child needs to be on the carpet, things put away ready for register and to learn, not when you are arriving at the entrance. Arriving late is disruptive to both your own child and the rest of the class. It is also likely your child will have missed some key learning for the day. This week **0.73%** of children were marked as late.

Ask me about...

Each week your class teacher will update this area with information about what your chid has been learning during the week so that you can ask them questions about it.

Ladybirds

This week the Ladybirds have been enjoying their new under the sea topic. We have been looking at different under the sea creatures as well as drawing our own. We have been using our dough to create under the sea creatures as well as seaweed and shells. We have been making patterns with our rocks and shells as well as using pegs to make patterns.

We have been working hard this week to regulate our emotions and have been practicing mindfulness techniques together. Our rainbow breathing, balloon breathing and bubble focus has helped us when our bodies and brains are feeling too busy. We have talked about what behaviours we like to see in Ladybirds and what behaviours are not ok.

Things from home

Please <u>do not</u> allow your child to bring in things from home <u>especially food!</u> These things are hard to monitor and we have had many incidents of things getting, lost and broken or disagreements breaking out over things from home. These things rarely stay in their bags, even when instructed, and we are not able to keep track of everyone's belongings. We have many children with allergies so it is very unsafe for children to bring food in that we are unaware of. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

Foundation Stage Two (Otters, Mice and Badgers)

This week we have been completing our final Read write inc.. assessments and maths assessments for the year and all the children have been really resilient and hard working.

In drawing club this week we've had a dive in to history with the Wacky Races animation and have been creating our drawings and writing around these.

In maths challenges children have been recalling number bonds to 5 and 10 and practising writing about sharks and fish in the writing challenges.

We have looked at the Big Bag of worries in PSED and children have talked about what they can do when they feel worried. Children have also been observing the Cress growth and talking about the experiment we made of providing water and light to one set of seeds and no water to another. Children made predictions and have enjoyed watching the pot that was watered grow.

Y1 (Hedgehogs, Squirrels and Foxes)

English – We have read our new text Supertato and used es and s suffixes to change nouns into singular or plural.

Maths – We have completed addition and subtraction number sentences within 20, 50 or 100

Computing – We learned about the toolbar

PE – Skipping and orienteering

RHE – We have learned about how we will change as we get older.

Science – We recapped our knowledge of our Science by completing a plants quiz.

RE – We have learned about how Jewish people care for others.

Geography – We learned about the surrounding seas of the UK.

Year 2 (Woodpeckers, Kingfishers and Eagles)

English – We have written our own character description on the Oompa Loompas.

Maths – We have been creating pictograms to represent data .

PSHE – We thought about what jobs we might want to do when we are adults and benefits and responsibilities of each age

RE – We learnt about the different features of a synagogue.

Computing – We used Scratch Junior to create our own sprite commands.

Geography – We have learnt about the difference between human and physical features.

We have also continued practising for our end of year play – keep learning your lines at home!
