


# Year 1 Writing Knowledge Organiser

Core text: Supertato by Sue Hendra and Paul Linnet



### Key Knowledge

#### By the end of this unit pupils will...

Orally compose, plan and write a character description of their own invented super villain. They will create their super villain out of recycled fruit or vegetables, give it a name and generate adjectives about their appearance and personality. They will also learn about singular and plural and adding suffixes "s" or "es" to turn a singular into a plural.

Plan and write the start of an innovated story based on Supertato including their invented villain. They will plan out what disasters their villain causes in the supermarket and use adjectives to describe.

"Supertato" is a fiction story about a superhero potato who saves the supermarket from a villain called Evil Pea. Evil Pea has escaped from the freezer and is causing chaos for the other fruit and vegetables. He made some of them walk a plank, drew on their faces and stuck them to the conveyer belt. Will Supertato be able to save the day, or will Evil Pea defeat him?

### Key Vocabulary

Villain	A villain is the bad character from a story who often caused harm to others.
Hero	A hero is a person who is admired for their courage, outstanding achievements, or qualities. They often help others.
Plurals	Plural means more than one item. When we turn a singular into a plural, we add 's' or 'es' Examples: cake – cakes vegetable – vegetables radish – radishes carrot – carrots box – boxes
