

The Dale Dyke Dam burst.	Over 1,000 homes were damaged.
Over six hundred homes were destroyed.	The flooding gradually worsened throughout the day.
At least 260 people died.	2 people died.
A relief fund was set up to help rebuild homes. The mayor of Sheffield gave £200.	£20 million was spent by the council on flood defences for the future.
The flooding happened quickly, with the force of water smashing buildings apart.	A natural disaster (unusual heavy rainfall).
It happened on 11th March 1864.	It happened on 25th June 2007.
A manmade disaster.	The River Don burst its banks.
