
Feeling Flesses

Key Learning: to plan a story




Success Criteria:

Independent task

Now it's time to start planning your own story onto the story mountain!



Draw your two main characters and the main setting of your story.

Use your science knowledge of the layers of the oceans - do your characters live in the coral reef? The deep sea? The polar seas?



What information will you need to include in your build up?

- Expanded noun phrase for your characters.
- Your "lost" character is taken / stolen / loses their way.
- Your "searching" character decides to look for them.

Flouder went to Flipper's house, but Flipper wasn't there.

He laaked in the bedroom and kitchen and he noticed the roof was broken.

Suddenly another fish swam over and told him she had seen Flipper be taken by a shark.

Flounder knew he had to go and find Flipper, so he quickly swam off to the dark, deep sea.




How will your story end?

Flipper hugged Flounder, and then the two friends swam home back to the caral reef.






