


Let's now take a look at the symbols that can be found within these Easter celebrations...

# Easter Eggs



Easter eggs are traditionally painted chicken eggs. They symbolise the **empty tomb**, from which Jesus emerged when he came back to life.



Easter eggs today are often made of chocolate. Many people who are not Christian may still exchange eggs at Easter as part of a cultural festival instead of a religious one.

## Hot Cross Buns

Hot Cross Buns are tasty buns baked with raisins and spices, and are usually eaten around Easter time.



Each bun is marked with the image of the cross to symbolise that **Jesus died** on the cross.

# Bunnies and chicks

Bunnies and chicks are often linked to Easter and can be found on Easter cards.



Bunnies and chicks are often born during the Spring (when Easter is celebrated) and symbolise **new life**.

# Easter flowers

White lillies, daffodils and tulips can often be found on Easter cards and used in churches at Easter.



These flowers all push through in the Spring, and symbolise **new life.** 

## The Cross

Jesus died on the cross, but he also rose again. It can be seen on Easter cards, tradition Easter eggs and in Church displays at Easter.



Christians believe that the cross symbolises both God's sacrifice and the good news of his victory over death.
