








An attribute is a way to describe something. When we collect data, we use attributes to describe and group our data together.

Attributes we use are things like...






Last week, lots of you collected data about the people in your class.

When you have used attributes to collect data about others in your class, you have been collecting personal information.

You then shared that data by creating a chart.

Is it always okay to share data?

It isn't OK to share personal information about someone else without their permission.

Some data might be personal, and you might not want to share it with others.









Can you give data to anyone who asks?

It isn't OK to share personal information with strangers.

It is always OK to say NO.









Can you share any data about yourself?

Some data is personal and should not be shared with others.

Who knows personal things about you?









These people know personal information because they look after you, or they need to know certain information to do their job!

But sometimes our personal information should be kept private.




