









At 5 o'clock he met a friendly ladybird. He asked it if it wanted to fight. Then he said "you`re not big enough!"








At 6 o'clock he met a wasp.







At 8 o'clock he met a praying mantis.









At 9 o'clock he met a sparrow.








At 11 o'clock he met a skunk.


















At 6 o'clock the whale flicked his tail and the ladybird ended up back at the aphid leaf.

TP: What have you noticed about the clock face?






The ladybird had a rest at 2 o'clock.


Model drawing the hands on the clock face. Remember the hour hand is the longer hand.


