Past continuous tense Match up the definition and tense:

When we want to talk about an action that was happening over a period of time in the past.

Past Continuous

When we want to talk about an action that was happening over a period of time in the past, we use the past continuous tense.

### For example:

This time last week I was lying on a beach in Florida.

It is often used to describe an action that happened in the middle of something else. It wouldn't really make sense

to say 'sat' here.

When I got home from school, the cat was sitting on the roof.
